ADVOCACY: DEAC provides systemic and individual advocacy for people with disabilities who have been discriminated against in the areas of employment, education and training.

REHABILITATION: DEAC provides a full range of vocational rehabilitation services including case management, psychology and occupational therapy for people with a disability and/or acquired injuries.

ACCESS: A national disability journal focussing on employment, education and training matters, with special emphasis on policy, practice and advocacy.
